Mission/Vision

Suits his Style is a non-profit corporation that supports the employment opportunities of men in need by providing professional attire with the vision of a world in which every man is given the opportunity to excel. The lack of access to appropriate interview attire can negatively influence the outcome of an interview, and be a barrier to a man's long term financial success. When men are able to enter an interview with confidence and gain employment, it not only improves their lives, it also improves ours.

What We Do

Joblessness can be devastating and can lead to poverty, poor health, turning to a life of crime, incarceration or addiction. This puts a strain on the life of the man, his family and society in general.

Clients are referred to Suits his Style by community partners at a time when men are ready to turn their lives around and are actively seeking employment. Appropriate interview and work attire can be economically prohibitive. Suits his Style provides dress clothing to men

in need to assist them in getting a job.

A man with a job and a chance to advance professionally is more likely to succeed, grow personally and professionally and be a leader to his family and community.


Suits his Style clients come from a wide variety of backgrounds. Our services have been extended to:


